



Poster Sessions

This year's conference newly offers the opportunity to present your work in a poster format! The poster session offers an abbreviated way to present research and/or promising practices in rural education.

Your work might be a good fit for a poster session if:

- Your research is emerging.
- You have a promising practice to share.
- You would like feedback before pursuing a research project.
- You are a student or early career scholar/practitioner (but scholars and practitioners at any stage in their career are welcomed and encouraged to present in a poster format).
- You are looking for a more informal way to share your work at any stage of the process.

Poster proposals **should be masked** and formatted using the following six headings:

1. Background and relevance to rural education and the event theme, *Raising Rural: A Fair Chance for a Good Life*
2. Purpose/problem this work aims to address (for research posters this might include research questions)
3. Description of the research or promising practice(s) (for research posters this might include methods and findings)
5. Discussion of implications of this work (or proposed work) for rural education, including key takeaways for practitioners
6. References

Length of the proposal should not exceed 500 words (exclusive of references).

Please upload the file using any of the following formats: PDF, DOC, DOCX, PNG, JPG, JPEG, or GIF.

Poster proposals will be peer reviewed by at least two members of the NREA research committee and selected based on reviewer scoring and recommendations.

Submissions that do not adhere to the format above will not be considered.
